Aryabhata:

Also known as the "Old Academic Block", Aryabhatta is the de-facto heart of the college. It houses the main reception, library, classrooms, labs, administration office, the director's office, faculty offices, etc. You can meet faculty anytime to ask questions or seek clarifications or advice. There is a library where you can go to study and/or borrow books. There's a sports room where you can go to issue sports equipment. This block also consists of labs and a PhD scholar's office. There is also a "Coffee Cove" where you can get coffee, tea, boost etc. during the college hours.

Ramanujan:

Also known as the "New Academic Block", the Ramanujan block houses computer labs and classrooms on the ground floor, research labs (MINRO and SRL) on the first floor, along with seminar halls on each floor. It was inaugurated in 2017 and houses the Auditorium and Sports Complex on the 3rd and 2nd Floor respectively. At the front Ramanujan Block is "The Thinker's Statue" which is by far the most popular spot for IIIT-Bians to get a good photo for their social media accounts. It also has another "Coffee Cove" to make sure students AND faculty never run low on caffeine:)

Panini:

To accommodate our growing student community, a new leased facility named Panini has been added adjacent to the main campus in the Prestige Alecto building. Operational by July, Panini will house two modern classrooms, a boardroom, a lounge, a large Self Study Hall (SSH), and a ready cloakroom. Named after the great Sanskrit scholar, Panini embodies our academic spirit. Though just outside campus, it will be well—connected via a walkway bridge near Aryabhata. This new space ensures a vibrant, resource—rich environment for learning, collaboration, and growth as you begin your journey at IIIT—B.

HOSTELS

Bhaskara:

Bhaskara, one of the two boys' hostels, houses around 70 triple sharing rooms on the first 2 floors and 400 single occupancy rooms on the remaining 5 floors. For the first two years students are expected to share their room with two other students. They are provided single rooms after the first two years. The rooms are well ventilated with two windows per room.



Visvesvaraya:

This is the other boys' hostel. There are 4 floors with around 90 rooms. Around 35 rooms are triple sharing with an attached bathroom and the others are single occupancy. The rooms are spacious with windows and each person gets their own cupboard and a desk.

Lilavati:


Lilavati is the girls hostel of IIIT—B. It has two wings. Students get single rooms for all years of the course. However, they will have to shift their rooms every one or two years. There are two guards in the hostel, round the clock, and there is also housekeeping staff who clean the rooms on a daily basis. There are around 260 rooms spread across 5 floors. The girls 'gym, Calorie Bee, is located within the hostel, along with common rooms and a pantry.

Uniworld:

This off-campus hostel offers a comfortable and student-friendly living environment. Each room includes a cot with mattress, study table, chair, and an attached bathroom for convenience, and is equipped with common high-speed Wi-Fi.









MULTIPURPOSE

The Multi-Purpose Hall or MPH is the recreational area for all the students at IIIT-B. It is on the ground floor of Bhaskara. It consists of ample seating, with tables and chairs, along with two foosball tables and also the men's qym: Shape Up. There are carrom and chess boards also in the

MPH to enjoy in your free time.










The MPH also houses the state of the art SAC room, music room and dance room. You can always come here and jam with your buddies in the music room or maybe practice some dance moves in the dance room.

This year, the 8Bit corner was also built in the MPH for students to come and sit together to study if they're tired of the student study halls or hangout while playing some games.

COLLEGE LIFE AND FACILITIES

Food Matters:

There is a common mess and canteen for all students on the ground floor of Bhaskara. The mess provides four time meals i.e. breakfast, lunch, evening snacks and dinner. A non-vegetarian (chicken) option is available thrice a week for dinner.

There is also a separate provision for Jain food. The menu of the mess changes after every two weeks and all food items at the canteen are present at affordable rates. The canteen timings are subject to change from time to time, but it usually



closes at 2 AM and re-opens at 10 AM. There are 2 TVs installed in the mess for the students to stream sports while dining too.

Parking:

Parking facilities on the campus are available for all students and faculties at two locations:

- 1. The Front Gate
- 2. Bhaskara Basement

JustVend:

There is a vending Machine on Campus which is open all day and is restocked regularly. Here you can use the JustVend App to order what you want.





Recreational Areas:

The Multi-Purpose Hall (MPH), located on the ground floor of Bhaskara, offers seating space where you can hang out, collaborate on group projects, or have team discussions. Similarly, Lilavati has cozy common rooms



with couches to relax on and study desks to get work done, along with a pantry for quick snacks. Outside the hostels, the pond is another favorite spot to unwind after an intense day of academics!

Laundry:

There is a laundry room in the basement of Bhaskara which has washing machines and dryers. You can drop off your laundry basket there and the

staff will do your laundry and you can collect it after 24 hrs. There are spaces available for drying clothes in the Hostels on each floor. If you want your clothes dried instanty using the dryer you need to pay Rs 100. There also is an ironing service at a per garment fixed price. You may avail these services on any day of

the week. The washing machines are run using a card which will be given to you by the college management. You need to use this card while giving your laundry.

Fire Safety and Emergency Exits:

All buildings are well-equipped with various fire safety measures like alarms, smoke detectors and water sprinklers.

There are emergency exits which are at a considerable distance

from each room.

Washrooms:

There are sufficient amounts of washrooms in both the hostel buildings which are cleaned everyday.

SPORTS FACILITIES

The following sports facilities are in the college:

- 1. Basketball court
- 2. Volleyball/Tennis Court
- 3. Throwball Court (in front of Lilavati)
- 4. 4 Indoor Badminton Courts
- 5. 3 Table Tennis Tables
- 6. 2 Foosball Tables

There is a general-purpose field where sports like football and cricket are played. Indoor games such as chess, carrom and table tennis are also played in the MPH. All the sports equipment can be issued from the sports room for a given period of time.

The timings of the gym are:

Monday - Saturday:

Morning 6:00 AM - 9:00 AM,

Evening 3:30 PM - 9:00 PM

On Sundays - Gym remains closed

Both men and women have separate gyms and have treadmills and bicycles for cardiovascular workout & also have all the required equipment for weight lifting and strength gaining exercises.

The men's gym - ShapeUp, which was recently renovated to double its size and number of equipments, is located in the MPH and the women's gym - CalorieBee is located inside the women's hostel.

Our fitness experts Mr. Girish Govind (for Men's gym) and Ms. Praseena M.S (for Women's gym) are available during the gym timings. They are responsible for making daywise workout plans and instructing your workout!











MEDICAL FACILITIES

The college has doctors available on campus for the following days and timings:

- 1. Dr Sachidanandam Muniswamy —
 Tues, Fri and Sat 6:00 pm to 9:00 pm
- 2. Dr Bharathi P Mon, Wed & Thurs 11:30 am to 2:00 pm



The consultation is free but you will need to buy the medicines on your own. We also have an on campus para-medic for immediate first aid.

There is an Apollo Pharmacy store at walking distance from the campus. The Institute also has counselling psychologists who visit the campus every week. Every student gets a





YourDost account, which provides free online counselling services.

In case of medical emergencies kindly contact the security personnel at the front desk in Aryabhatta, who will arrange for an ambulance at any time. This is a free service provided by Kauvery hospital.



IIIT-B you get free one-on-one couseling sessions where you can even choose an appropriate time an appropriate time according to your schedule. They ensure the following during a session:










The College Magazine Club

THINGS TO BRING

Your luggage, which will consist of clothes, footwear, toiletries and other personal items.;

- Sports shoes (First years have compulsory Physical Education classes)
- Scientific calculator
- Lock and key for the room

- Any medicine that you may require (There is no pharmacy inside the college but an outlet of Apollo pharmacy is located very close to the campus)
- Extension cord (Not mandatory but recommended)
- The following things will be available in the campus at competitive prices (can be brought from outside too): Mattress 3x6 ft (Bigger size mattresses can be ordered) and bed sheets, pillows, bathroom supplies buckets, mugs, soap, clothes hangers, etc.
- There is a D-Mart outlet located approximately 1.5 kms away from campus for purchasing necessary daily-use utilities, snacks and clothes. For any stationery related equipment, there is a store named Kumkum enterprises at a walking distance from the campus.

IMPORTANT

Electric appliances such as iron, stove, induction plate etc. are not permitted in hostel rooms. Use of these will attract punitive actions and penalties from the Institute.

DISCIPLINE

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. There should be complete silence on corridors near classrooms during class hours to maintain an academic atmosphere. Students must not loiter in the corridors during class hours.
- 2. No student is allowed to leave the lecture hall without the faculty's permission or until the lecture is finished.
- 3. Students are not permitted to smoke or use tobacco, alcohol or any such substance on the institute campus. They are liable to severe disciplinary action (even dismissal) if found violating the norms on the campus.
- 4. Strict disciplinary action (even dismissal) will be taken against any student found in possession of, or under the influence of drugs or alcohol.
- 5. Ragging is forbidden by the laws of the country. Students found ragging will be handed over to the police. They may be dismissed from the institute.
- 6. Unbecoming language or conduct, obscenity in word or deed renders a student liable to disciplinary action which may involve suspension, fine or dismissal.
- 7. The campus must be kept clean at all times. Littering with wrappers, waste paper, defacing the walls or desks, damaging the institute property etc. are offences and are liable for punitive action.

- 8. Though the institute is not responsible for the conduct of its students outside the premises, it will take note of any serious misconduct outside the campus.
- 9. Students must observe punctuality. At the discretion of the course instructor, the student may be permitted to enter the classroom if they are late. However, if the student is regularly late to the class, they may not be permitted to attend classes.
- 10. Every student is required to carry their identity card in the institute and display it whenever required. The card should be shown to any member of the staff or institute officials whenever asked for. These identity cards are also used for recording the movement (entry/exit) of the students.
- 11. The institute expects every student to take active participation in non-academic functions and cultural programs. However, such events shall be held only after class hours. Practice for all programs should be held outside of class hours.

VISITORS

Timings on regular days for visitors to the campus are between 10 AM and 7 PM. Nobody except the students are allowed to be in the hostel rooms at any time during their stay at IIIT—B. This ensures the privacy and safety of you and the students around you.

LAPTOP GUIDE

Choosing the right laptop for you can play a significant role in easing your life for the next 4 or 5 years. Here's a short guide to help you get the basics and some absolute do's and dont's to keep in mind. As always, we strongly recommend you to do your own research aside from this, and try to look at reviews from Youtube or other resources.

WINDOWS Laptops:

 <u>PROCESSOR</u>: We would suggest choosing between an Intel i5 or i7. On the AMD side, Ryzen 5 or Ryzen 7 is recommended. While i5 or Ryzen 5 will suffice for most college tasks, opting for i7 or Ryzen 7 will make computationally heavy tasks easier and faster, ideal for compiling software, editing videos, and working with large databases. However they may offer a slightly worse battery life.

<u>NOTE</u>: It is advisable not to buy laptops with Snapdragon CPU's since a lot of apps that you might use in your courses may not be supported as of today.

- RAM: A minimum of 16 GB of RAM is recommended especially since you will be running multiple
 apps at times and multitasking will be smoother with more RAM. More RAM also allows for smooth
 video editing and running heavy programs. More RAM will also future proof your laptop, so it is
 highly recommended.
- STORAGE: We strongly recommend buying a laptop with SSD, as there is a night and day difference in boot time and overall experience in using SSD's vs HDD's. However laptops with both SSD and HDD are great too if you need the extra storage. While 256 GB storage might suffice, 512 GB storage is recommended since you will be dual booting your laptop too and you will lose a considerable amount of storage there.
- <u>GRAPHICS CARD</u>: Integrated Graphics Card which is built into the CPU is ENOUGH for everyday use and all academic purposes. However if you wish to play video games or do lots of video editing, only then buy a laptop with a dedicated GPU. Mostly Nvidia and AMD offer dedicated GPU's on laptops. (Completely optional)
 - 1. Nvidia GPU's: RTX 3050/3060 should be enough for most people, but if you really want to spend more and get more performance then choose a RTX 4050/4060. Only thing to keep in mind is ensure that the GPU's TDP is above 90 Watts, else it offers very poor performance. (Some laptops may have a RTX 3060/4060 but offer only 65 75 Watts TDP on the GPU, which will perform worse than a 3050/4050 which has 110 Watts TDP)

2. AMD's Radeon GPU's: If you want their absolute best laptop GPU's, look for Radeon RX 6000/7000 series like RX 7800M or RX 6700S where S = Slim laptops, M = Mainstream/High-performance laptops. For casual video editing or casual gaming with medium settings, Radeon Pro 6000/7000 series should be good enough and you will save a lot of money.

<u>NOTE</u>: Even for ML purposes, you wont need a dedicated GPU as most of the work will be done on the cloud.

- <u>SCREEN SIZE</u>: Opt for 13-16 inches for portability and usability, but it is better if you get an idea of what is suitable for you by viewing laptops in offline stores. 17 inches and above is bulky for most, and is harder to carry in laptop bags too, but can be managed.
- <u>ADDITIONAL FEATURES</u>: Make sure that the laptop you buy has decent build quality which you can see in reviews online or go see the laptop in offline stores. Ensure a battery life of over 8 hours, especially for long college days. Gaming laptops will have a poor battery life, so if you are planning on buying one, ensure it has a great battery life so it doesn't drain out too fast. (Above 70 Whr should be good enough)

MACBOOK AIR:

If you don't have any interest in gaming and have a budget of over 80k, buying a MacBook may seem like the obvious choice for its excellent screens, unmatched battery life and light weight yet durable build quality. Some things to keep in mind before buying a MacBook Air:

- 1. Do not buy the old MacBook Air laptops with intel CPU's in them, as they are terrible in performance and battery life.
- 2. Most students don't exploit the full power of a MacBook Air itself, and hence it may make sense to not buy a MacBook Pro (unless u want to flex hehe)... If you have the budget it is instead advisable to buy more storage and RAM on your MacBook Air itself as it will make a huge difference.
- 3. If possible, buy it from the official website with the student discount offer and other accessories that they might provide for free.
- 4. An M2 MacBook Air does the job for most people, but if you prefer a larger screen size (15 inch) and a bit more battery life and performance, you can opt for M2 or M3 or M4 with 15 inch screen if it suits your budget.
- 5. 16 GB of RAM on your MacBook is the minimum RAM required as you might feel the difference 3-4 years down the line.
- 6. A MacBook is not advisable to ECE students since some software that you use in your electronics courses may not be compatible with MacBooks.

As always, do your own extensive research, and don't overspend more than you need. Armed with this knowledge, we hope you can make an informed decision and feel content with whatever you purchase. Happy shopping!
