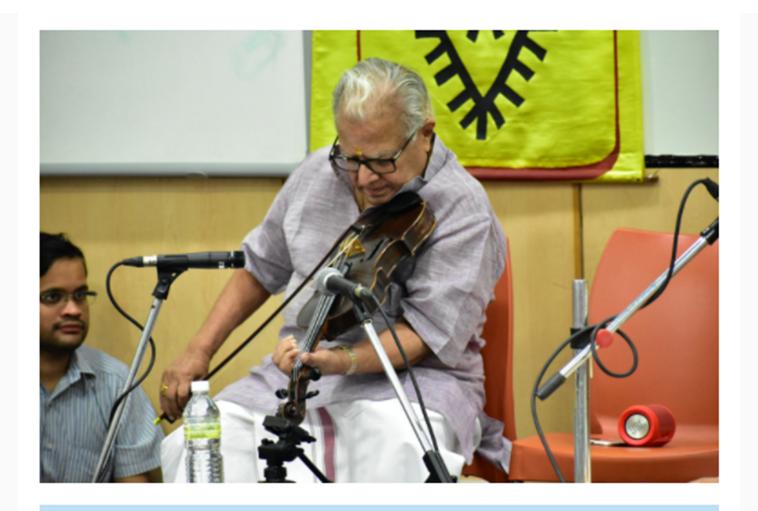

Centre for Information Technology and Public Policy (CITAPP) at IIIT Bangalore along with the Everett Programme for Technology and Change at the University of California Santa Cruz organized a workshop on "Economic Inclusivity in India: Conceptual and Empirical Recommendations for an Indicator Framework" on August 19. This workshop is a part of a larger study on Inclusive Economies, supported by the Rockefeller Foundation. In its attempt to better promote inclusive economies, the researchers in the project team are developing a framework to better understand and measure inclusivity, focusing on five broad dimensions, namely, growth, equity, participation, stability and sustainability. The workshop was attended by the experts from within Bengaluru and other parts of the country where the project team presented its findings from applying the framework in the Indian context and sought expert opinion on the relevance and usefulness of the framework on different aspects of inclusivity and development in India.
