From the Director's Desk

We turned several new leaves as we ushered the new year in. We have great additions in our faculty, with Dr. V. Ramasubramanian and Manish Gupta accepting their offers in early January. Yet another batch of Samsungsponsored M. Tech programme, Master of Science by Research and Doctor of Philosophy programmes joined at the beginning of the term. Our campus warmly welcomed six more faculty members from Myanmar on January 9, for the nine-month-long training program at IIIT-B as part of MIIT Mentoring activity. His work at the Jawaharlal Nehru Planetarium, as its first Director, is notable. Prof. C. V. Vishveshwara, a stalwart in Indian science, will be missed.

The ACM ICPC is an annual multi-tier programming competition among top universities from all over the world and is widely regarded as the "Olympics" of programming and one of the most challenging programming competitions in the world.
