From the Director's Desk



October continues with the festive season which started in September. We celebrated Diwali on campus. Everyone in campus enjoyed the midterm break and got back energized to complete the rest of Term I. October 2017 was busy as usual with a Governing Body Meeting, research degree programmes admission cycle and several other events.

As usual, October is special because it is the month of Nobel prize announcement. This year's prizes were announced in the first week of October. The Nobel prize for Physics went to the scientists at the LIGO/VIRGO collaboration, namely Rainer Weiss, Barry Barish, and Kip Thorne, "for decisive contributions to the LIGO detector and the observation of gravitational waves."

IndIGO, the consortium of Indian gravitational wave physicists, had also contributed in a big way in the discovery of the gravitational waves. We salute our scientists, late Prof. C. V. Vishveshwara and Sanjeev Dhurandhar, and the thirty-seven Indian scientists who co-authored the seminal paper in Physics Review Letters in 2016 on the detection of the waves. The work on detection of gravitational waves has truly been a global team effort, even though Nobel prize can only be given to three at most and this time to the three who built the LIGO detector. Prof. Vishveshwara was close to IIIT Bangalore. He had given a talk at IIIT Bangalore in 2001 and agreed to talk to us in the year 2015 about gravitational waves, which, unfortunately, had to be cancelled owing to his ill health!

To celebrate the International Day of Girl Child, the British High Commission in India had organised a competition for female students aged between 17 and 25 to win an opportunity to become the British High Commissioner to India for a day. The competitors had to submit a short video presentation on the topic: "Girls rights and two things they would do to bring about change." The entry Vidhya Y. (2015 batch MSc Digital Society student) was selected but however she could not travel to Delhi. Hence, she received a special invitation to be the British Deputy High Commissioner in Bangalore for half a day on October 16. As a part of her engagement, she met with the British Deputy High Commissioner, Dominic McAllister and the different teams at the British Deputy High Commission and British Council offices in Bengaluru. They briefed her about their work and sought her views about empowerment of girls and women in different spheres of life. They also briefed her about UK-India partnerships in science & innovation, culture, trade & investment.

After her graduation, Vidhya along with Supriya Dey (a former IIITB MS by Research student) has set up Vision Empower, a not-for-profit trust that aims to work towards making science and maths education inclusive for persons with visual impairment. VE is presently incubated at the IIITB Innovation Centre.

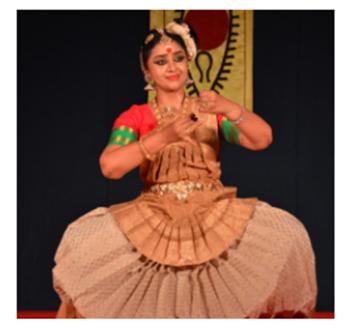

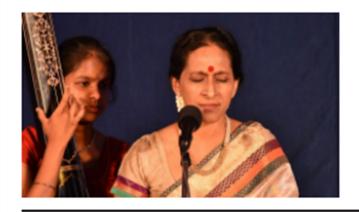
